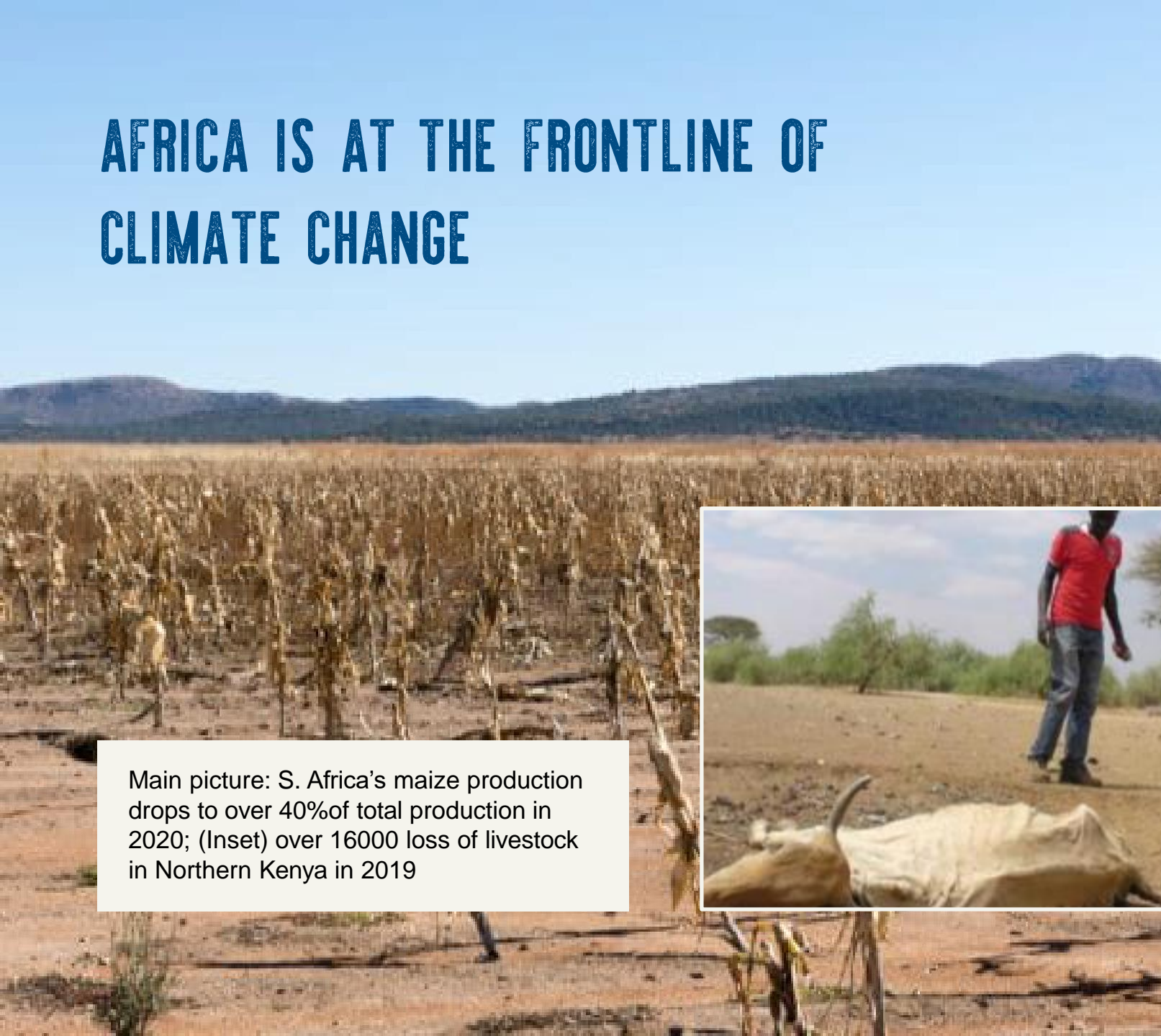

AFRICA IS AT THE FRONTLINE OF CLIMATE CHANGE

7 of the **10** countries most at risk from climate change are in Africa

Up to **30%** increase in the spread of diseases like cholera and malaria

Over **12** million people in Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia are in dire need of food and suffer from acute malnutrition

Over **1/2 MILLION** people displaced in Northern Kenya due to drought

The youth comprise of 75% of the total population in Africa, and remain the most vulnerable and least prepared.

- Live in extreme poverty

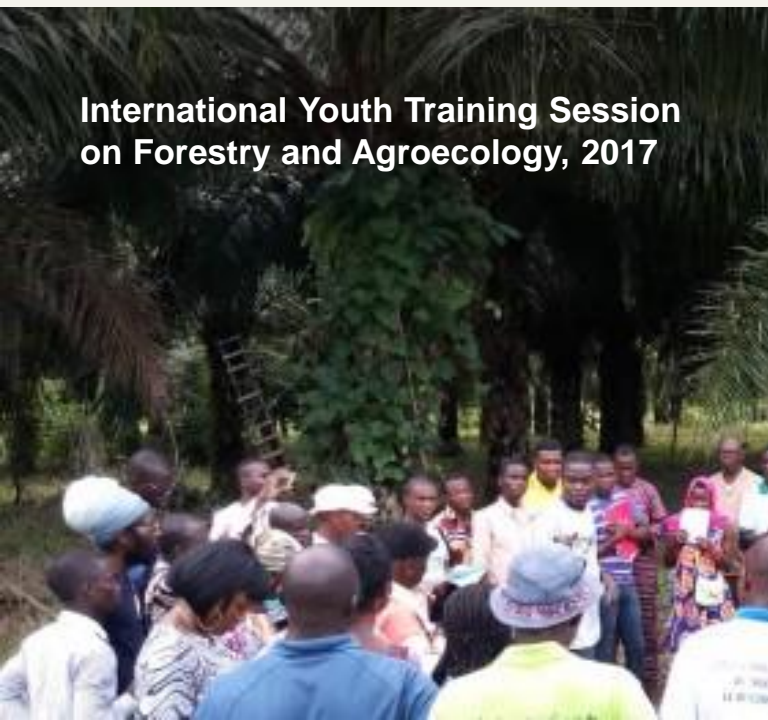

- Hopped from one job to another with little income
- Victorine discovered her passion in the field working with people when she started her training with JVE in 2012
- Trained in communication, social marketing and solar system installation

- Distributes on average 1000 solar lamps a year in Togo
- Recruited and trained 68 distributors
- Opened 2 solar kiosks
- Sensitized over 2000 people
- Gains a stable income to expand her outreach and business

THE IMPACT OF ONE SOLAR ENTREPRENEUR



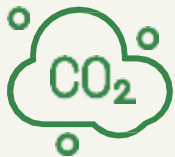
Distributes **1500** lamps per year



Saves upto **70%** household income used to buy kerosene



Employs a minimum **100** distributors in one year



Helps Reduce an average of **92 tonnes/** year of CO2 in the atmosphere



Gains on average **\$50,000** income annually

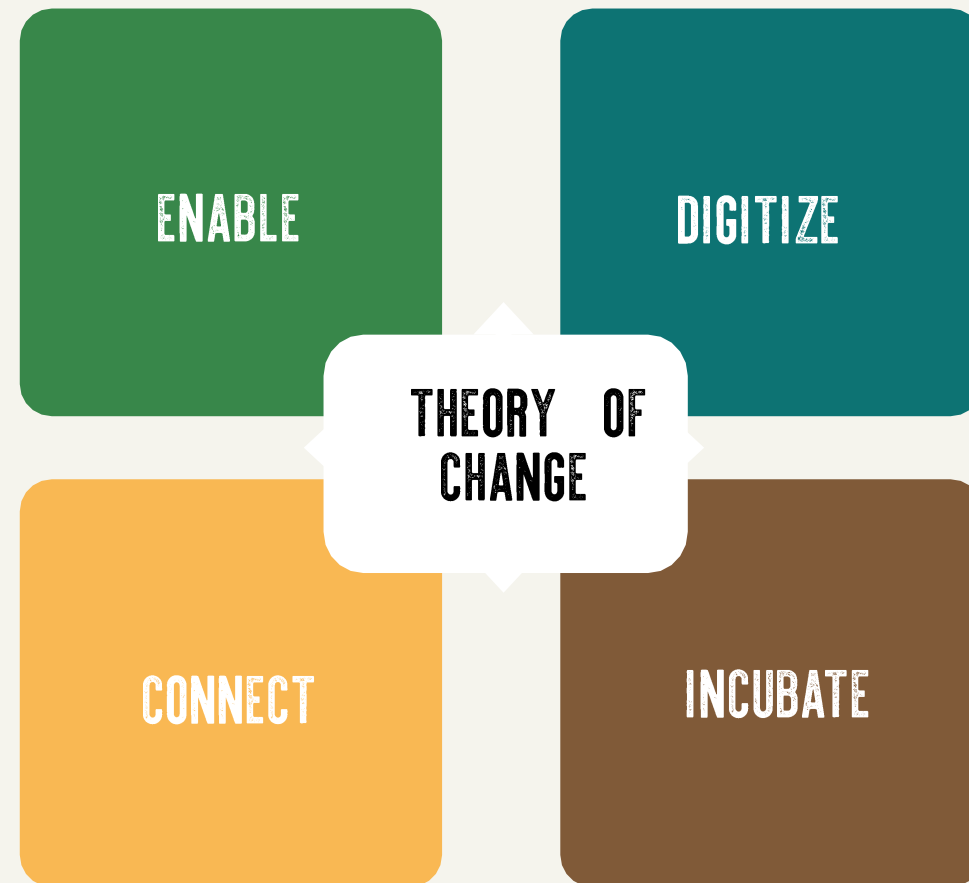

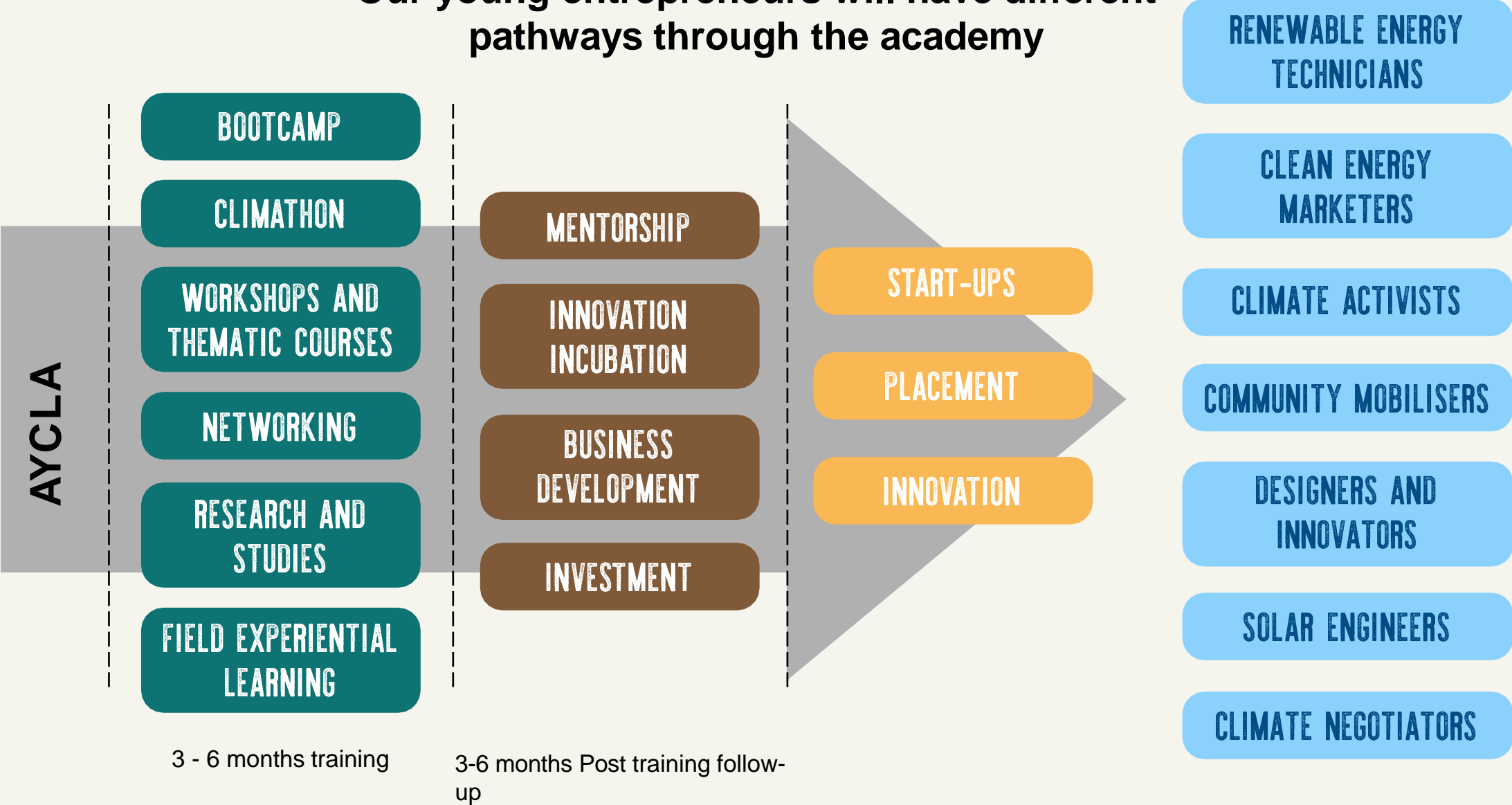

You have the opportunity to sponsor as many young people as possible to support the achievement of our goal.



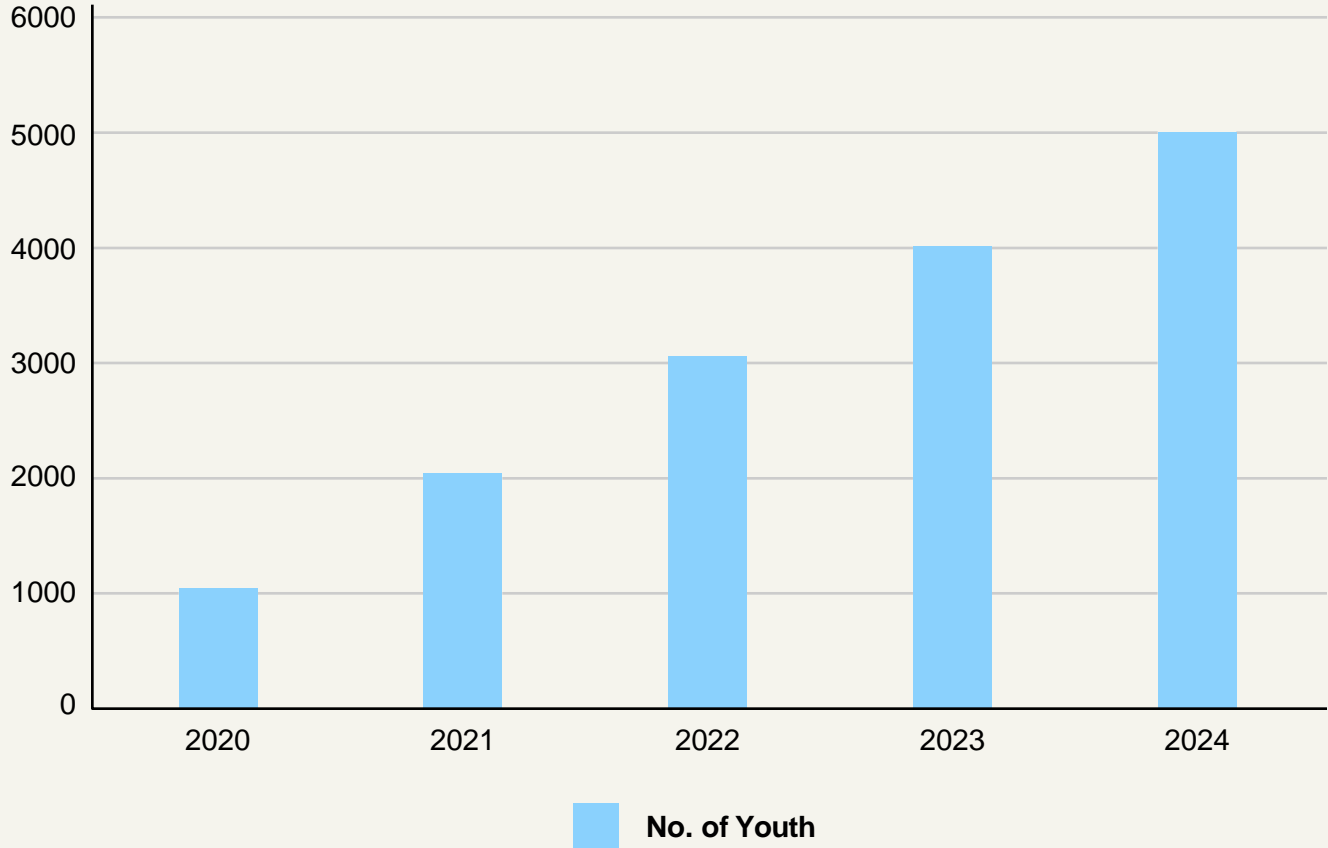

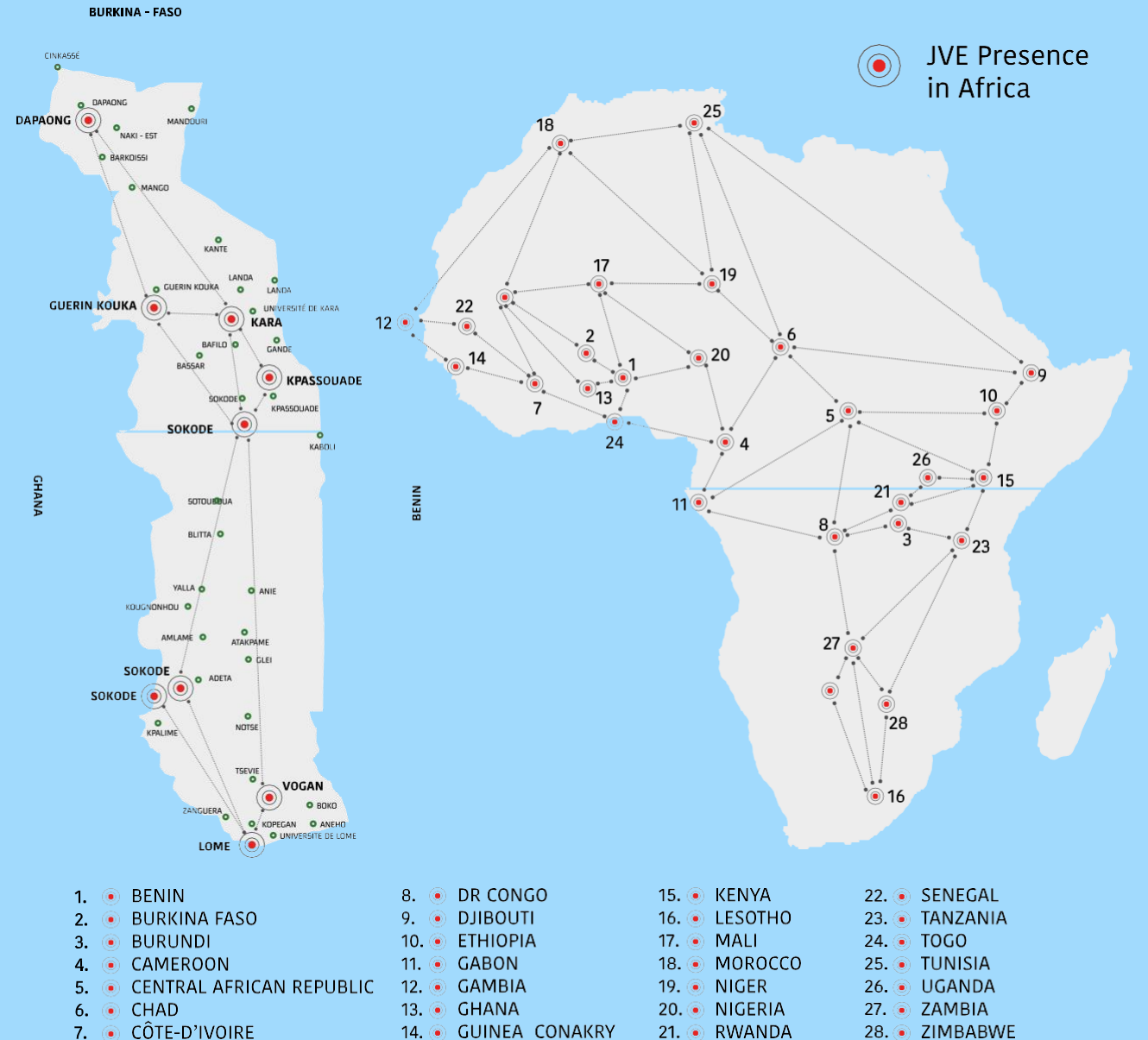
