Social entrepreneurs have to be trusted across different stakeholder groups to inspire major structural changes to society.






SELECTION PROCESS



Our expertise: supporting social entrepreneurs to scale



The Ashoka Fellowship is a unique blend of financial support to the entrepreneur and lifelong support through the network. It includes the Ashoka's global label, a prestigious Fellowship for social entrepreneurs as well as critical support through the 5 C's framework:

- **Capital:** a 3-year unrestricted stipend to the social entrepreneur to enable them to focus full-time on their social venture and reduce their risk
- **Community of peers:** a global resource directory, peer-to-peer connections and support \bullet
- **Connections** to opportunities for growth and to possible supporters across sectors (visibility, funding, etc.) \bullet
- Capacity building: focused on core issues such as systems-change, financial sustainability and personal sustainability
- **Collaborative models:** bringing together "mosaics of solutions" around a given topic and building synergies for impact


